A Model for Coordination and Education: Help Me Grow

Help Me Grow is a resource that coordinates local services with training and information to facilitate community connection. A primary tenet of the model is support and education for parents with regard to early childhood development, involvement in early care/education, and development/milestone tracking. Increased understanding about child social-emotional competencies and health care resources will not only increase service delivery at the local level, but also decrease parental stress. A vehicle for program and service coordination, the Help Me Grow model emphasizes the importance of an interconnected network between families, healthcare providers, and early childhood professionals. This framework ensures flourishing children and stronger families. In this webinar, the HVCI team and PCANY are joined by Dr. Liz Izakson, Executive Director of Docs for Tots, and Laurie Black, Director of Early Childhood Alliance, for a presentation on the Help Me Grow model.
